### Professor Sam Fleischacker, "Moses and Modernism: Schönberg and Mondrian as Twentieth Century Prophets"

Thursday, January 14th

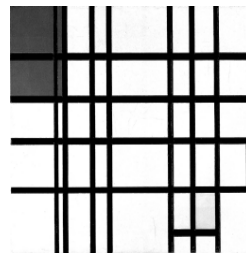
Reception at 6:30 PM, Lecture at 7:00 PM



In connection with the Metropolitan Opera premiere of Schönberg's *Moses Und Aron* on Feb. 8, 1999, Professor Fleischacker will offer a philosophical context for coming to grips with Schönberg's innovations in modern music, comparing those innovations, in part, with the projects of such modernist painters as Piet Mondrian and Mark Rothko. He will also discuss ways in which Schönberg tried to use his music in general, and this opera in particular, to provide a vision of Judaism suited for the

modern world.

Fleischacker is associate professor of philosophy at Williams, specializing in moral and political philosophy, and teaching



courses as well on aesthetics, and the philosophy of Immanuel Kant. He taught a Winter Study course on Freud and Schönberg in 1993, and, together with his wife, the architect Amy Reichert, led a Winter Study travel course on "Modernist Architecture in India" this past January. His publications include *The Ethics Of Culture* and the forthcoming *A Third Concept Of Liberty: Judgment And Freedom In Kant And Adam Smith*.

Barbara Ernst Prey '79 is well-known to the Williams College community as well as to the Williams Club—her prints of common Williams landmarks can be seen throughout the building. This month Jensen Fine Arts will present a selection of watercolors by Ms. Prey from January 21 through February 6th. Scenes of mid-coastal Maine, rural western Pennsylvania, Long Island and Connecticut will be featured along with delicate still-lives of shells and flowers. Barbara Prey creates distinctive, realistic watercolors that are rendered in sharp focus with accents of looser handling and varied brushstrokes. Through her characteristic use of light and color, Prey transforms familiar scenes—sheep in a meadow,



a wicker chair on a porch, quilts billowing on a line, sea shells against old lace—into evocative compositions.

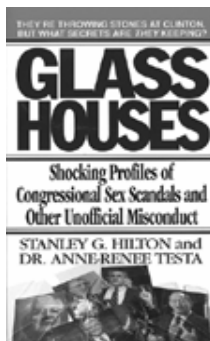
A graduate of Williams College in 1979, Ms. Prey went on to Harvard Divinity School where she earned a masters degree. Prey has received a Fullbright Scholarship and a Henry Luce Foundation Grant. The past summer she was an "Artist in Residence" at the Westminster School in Simsbury, CT. Her paintings are included in important public collections such as The Farnsworth Art Museum, The Williams College Museum of Art, The Taiwan Museum of Art and the Henry Luce Foundation as well as private collections such as those of President and Mrs. George Bush, Governor Hugh Carey, Mr. and Mrs. S. 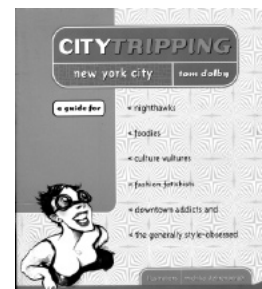

Among these products is DIAMONDS, a new security representing 30 sticks in the Dow Jones Industrial Average. Trading for DIAMONDS was kicked off on January 20, 1998 on the American Stock Exchange.
