with the projects of such modernist painters as Piet Mondrian and Mark Rothko. He will also discuss ways in which Schönberg tried to use his music in general, and this opera in particular, to provide a vision of Judaism suited for the modern world.

Fleischacker is associate professor of philosophy at Williams, specializing in moral and political philosophy, and teaching courses as well on aesthetics, and the philosophy of Immanuel Kant. He taught a Winter Study course on Freud and Schönberg in 1993, and, together with his wife, the architect Amy Reichert, led a Winter Study travel course on "Modernist Architecture in India" this past January. His publications include *The Ethics Of Culture* and the forthcoming *A Third Concept Of Liberty: Judgment And Freedom In Kant And Adam Smith*.
