Prey's twenty-five years of painting has earned her both respect and recognition in the art world and she is considered one of the foremost landscape painters working in the United States today. This year's exhibit, "Lightscapes", captures the very essence of Prey's intricate brushstrokes, compelling use of light, and intuitive sense of color. In this exhibition, Prey examines how light transforms familiar scenes--quilts billowing on a line, a wicker chair on a porch, seashells against old lace--into unique compositions.

Ms. Prey's paintings are included in public collections such as the Farnsworth Art Museum, Williams College Museum of Art, The Taiwan Museum of Art, and the Henry Luce Foundation. 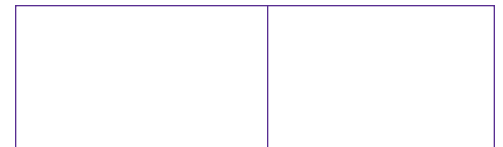

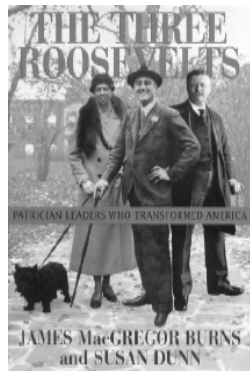

James MacGregor Burns & Susan Dunn, Authors of The Three Roosevelts: Patrician Leaders Who Transformed America

These authors follow the evolution of the Roosevelt political philosophy and explore how Theodore's example of dynamic, visionary leadership would inspire the careers of his distant cousin Franklin and his niece Eleanor.

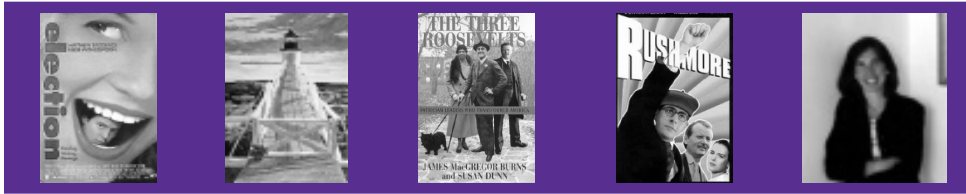
