For many, baseball is not just a game with rules, but a romantic vision of what it means to have fun; in America it is our national pastime. And yet baseball is also a business, with a history of labor disputes, great expansion, and--some might say--near collapse. The game as it is played today in the Major Leagues, has evolved tremendously since its first incarnations in the grassy lots of Manhattan and New Jersey; what course is baseball likely to take in the future?

Today's panel will include baseball experts and luminaries from the history of the game. While some panelists are yet to be determined, confirmed guests include Frank Boulton, head of the independent Atlantic League and owner of the Long Island Ducks; Williams College President Morty Schapiro, an economist and avid baseball fan; and, Professor Andrew Zimbalist of Smith College, an economist and expert on the economics of sports.

Topics for discussion will likely include baseball's economics and labor issues, the financing of stadiums, the Designated Hitter, Pete Rose and the Hall of Fame, interleague play, the strike zone, the alleged paucity of pitching talent, the popularity or lack of popularity of baseball among young boys and girls in the U.S. (from the suburbs to the inner cities), the blossoming of the minor leagues, the length of games, the sport's history (including the controversy over its origins), diversity in the front office, etc.

Civil War Historian, Professor Charles Dew '58 Author of Apostles of Disunion

Williams College Professor Charles Dew '58 will discuss his new book, *Apostles of Disunion: Southern Secession Commissioners and the Causes of the Civil War* tonight at the Club. His third book on the Civil War, *Apostles of the Disunion* presents a provocative argument that during the war, slavery and race were "absolutely critical factors at the heart of our great national crisis." Professor Dew traces the speeches and writings of state-appointed commissioners who traveled across the South in late 1800's raising support for secession and uncovers "a stark white supremacist ideology" that, he says, refutes neo-Confederate claims that slavery and race were only peripheral factors leading to the war.

Professor Dew is the W. Van Alan Clark '41 Third Century Professor in the Social Sciences at Williams College and has written an extensive array of articles, essays and books on the Civil War. He will be available after the talk to sign books. Professor Colin Adams, "Why Knot?"

Spend the evening with one of Williams most dynamic personalities, Williams College Professor Colin Adams, discussing the past history of knots as well as their future. Knots have appeared everywhere from art, literature, and religion to sea-faring. Discover the role they play in mathematics and the applications of that role to DNA and synthetic chemistry. This will be an interactive talk with everyone in attendance getting an opportunity to try their hand at making knots.

Professor Adams is the Francis Christopher Oakley Third Century Professor of Mathematics at Williams College. He received his Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1983 and has been at Williams since 1985. He is the author of *The Knot Book*, an elementary introduction to the mathematical theory of knots and co-author with Joel Hass and Abigail Thompson of *How to Ace Calculus: The Streetwise Guide* and *How to Ace the Rest of Calculus: The Streetwise Guide*, humorous supplements to the calculus curriculum. He is also the author of a mathematical humor column called *Mathematically Bent* which appears in the *Mathematical Intelligencer*.

Seth Rogovoy '82, "Rockin' the Shtetl: A Journey through Klezmer Music"

The bittersweet sounds of clarinet- and violin-driven klezmer music fuel some of today's hottest avant-garde jazz. Celebrated in Jewish communities for centuries in Europe and America, Klezmer has journeyed from Old World shtetls (villages) to New World nightclubs and stages. Music critic and author Seth Rogovoy, Williams Class of 1982, will trace the evolution of klezmer from its origins as a highly codified ritual dance music to its popularization in the early 20th century as a nostalgic evocation of a lost world, through its triumphant breakthrough to the masses in the Swing era, to today's thriving contemporary klezmer revival.

Mr. Rogovoy is the author of the critically acclaimed book, *The Essential Klezmer: A Music Lover's Guide to Jewish Roots and Soul Music* and has been the music critic for the *Berkshire Eagle* for over a decade. He is also a faculty adjunct at Williams College, where he teaches in the Winter Study program.
