Forms can be e-mailed, faxed or snail-mailed but must be received by Program and Marketing Director Rich von Bargen by Wednesday, March 1st. Please, only one form per membership.

The lottery will be held Friday, March 3rd at 3 p.m. There will also be a drawing at the 1st Annual Baseball Lovers' Evening for the right to get first choice in the lottery. "Winners" will be awarded the top available tickets on their form at the time they are picked. Once a member has "won" tickets to a game, their name will be removed from the lottery. If any tickets remain after the lottery, a second lottery will be held. "Winners" will be informed following the lottery.

Robert Bell is William R. Kenan Professor of English at Williams. In 2004 The Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching and the Council for the Advancement and Support of Education named him "Outstanding Baccalaureate College Professor of the Year." He is also a long-time baseball and Red Sox fan. Bob's subject is Ted Williams, the first or second-best hitter in baseball history. We'll focus on Ted's career with the Boston Red Sox (1939-1960), his glorious feats and fabled frustrations, and discuss his personality and character.

Seth Schwartz, a graduate of Trinity College '98, is a fantasy sports enthusiast having participated in multiple fantasy leagues in each of the past five years. He will discuss several aspects of running a successful fantasy baseball league. Such topics will include league format, choosing a commissioner, scoring set up, draft strategy and resources, working the waiver wires, and awarding prizes. Designed as an introduction to fantasy baseball, he will cover all the bases so you come off looking like a veteran instead of a rookie.

Scott Rosenberg of Triple Crown Sports will give a presentation on the authentication of baseball memorabilia. He'll talk about how to spot a fake, and will bring some samples with him. He will also be providing items to be displayed in The Williams Club Art Gallery for sale throughout the Spring Training season. Mike Glier '75 Artwork Showcased In The Club



While the hallway outside of The Grill Room has become a destination itself, as guests meander downstairs to view the artwork lining The Gallery's walls, our exhibition space is about to multiply threefold. From early March through mid-June, paintings and sculptures spanning the artistic career of Williams Alumnus and Professor Mike Glier '75 will similarly be showcased on the First and Second Floors of The Club, providing you with yet another enticing reason to stop by. Glier's paintings and drawings address issues ranging from masculinity and fatherhood to satisfaction and beauty. In addition to solo and group exhibitions

around the world, he has created permanent installations such as *Full Moon on the Hoosick*, in North Adams, MA. His current project, *Backyard*, is about looking closely at things that are very near, and celebrating them. The colors and lines in this work spring from a direct study of nature, as seen, for example, in a hue of green that Glier derived from the underside of a watermelon.

After graduating from Williams, Glier continued his education in New York at the Whitney Museum of American Art and Hunter College. He received a National Endowment for the Arts Fellowship in Drawing in 1981 and was a John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation Fellow in Painting in 1996.

Social Psychology Professor Steven Fein (4/6)

The Social Psychology of Stereotyping & Prejudice: Self-Esteem, Social Influence, & Bruce Springsteen



What factors make stereotyping and prejudice so prevalent and difficult to change? Can they operate nonconsciously and, if so, how can we know it? How can we answer difficult questions such as whether racism played a role in tragic events such as when an unarmed African immigrant was killed in a hail of 41 shots fired by New York City police officers several years ago (an incident that inspired a song by Bruce Springsteen, which in turn triggered another storm of controversy in New York)? Most discussions of topics like these tend to be highly politicized and subjective. This talk will present social psychological research in an attempt to illustrate a more scientific approach to understanding these issues. This research will demonstrate some of the factors that

increase or decrease stereotyping and prejudice, and how we are all affected by these issues, often in subtle and yet profound ways. The talk will also feature some music and perhaps a *Seinfeld* clip or two.

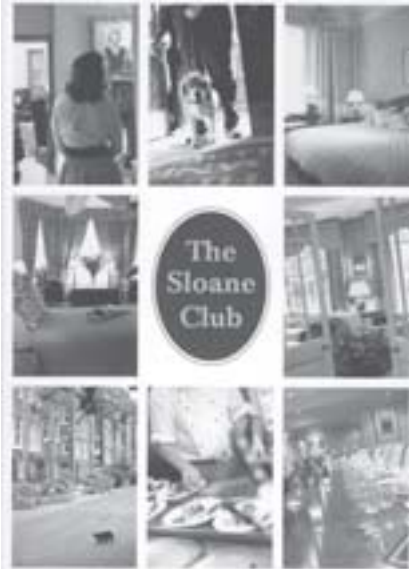
